Lead Story: The Model Creche Initiative in Patna and Gaya



The Model Creche Initiative seeks to break this cycle by providing a comprehensive solution to the childcare needs of urban ultra-poor households. By establishing Model Creches in strategic locations such as Patna and Gaya, JEEVIKA aims to create safe and nurturing environments where children can thrive while their parents are at work. Operated in collaboration with esteemed partners like BRAC, PCI India, and Mobile Creche, these creches offer a range of essential services including childcare, nutrition, health check-ups, and hygiene maintenance—all free of charge to the families.

The inauguration of Mobile Creches - Palna Ghar on October 5th, 2023, represented a crucial step in addressing the needs of ultra-poor families as part of the SJY-Urban initiative. This event, led by Sri Rahul Kumar, IAS, then CEO of JEEVIKA, in the presence of Ms. Shweta Banerjee, Country Head of BRAC, and key officials, highlighted a collaborative effort to support vulnerable urban communities. The initiative's core aim is to offer holistic care for children from ultra-poor families, enabling parents, especially mothers, to participate in income-generating activities. To ensure quality care, twenty members from Self-Help Groups (SHGs) underwent specialized training to become expert caregivers. Smt. Surbhi Kumari and Smt. Mamta Devi emerged as skilled Creche Caregivers, selected to oversee the well-being of children from endorsed families in the Dhaniya Bagicha locality.

Palna Ghar currently serves 15 children, providing essential services including nutritional support, life-skills activities, and physical care. Since its inception, the impact has been notable: approximately 60-70% of mothers have been able to engage in various income-generating activities, ranging from sewing and domestic work to daily wage labor. This shift represents a tangible step towards breaking the cycle of poverty within these families.

What sets the Model Creches apart is their holistic approach to childcare. Staff members undergo rigorous training to ensure that they are equipped with the skills and knowledge necessary to provide quality care to the children entrusted to them. From infancy to early childhood, each child receives individualized attention and support tailored to their developmental needs. Moreover, the creches prioritize the well-being of the children by maintaining high standards of hygiene and sanitation, thereby creating a conducive environment for growth and learning.

By establishing parents committees tasked with overseeing the functioning of the creches, JEEVIKA ensures that the voices of the community are heard and their concerns addressed. This participatory approach not only fosters trust and cooperation but also empowers parents to actively engage in the decision-making process, thereby strengthening community bonds and promoting collective well-being.

Beyond their immediate impact on women's workforce participation, the Model Creches serve as a beacon of hope and progress for urban ultra-poor households. Assessing JEEVIKA's SJY Impact through Monitoring and Evaluation

Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) stands as the cornerstone of effective program implementation and sustainable development initiatives worldwide. In recent times, the significance of M&E has been underscored as organizations seek evidence-based approaches to address complex societal challenges. Recognizing this critical need, on 18th March 2024, JEEVIKA, in collaboration with J-PAL and CLEAR SA, organized a comprehensive training session aimed at deepening understanding and building capacity in M&E, particularly focusing on randomized evaluations. The training commenced with an opportunity for networking and fostering a conducive learning environment. As participants gathered, the stage was set for an enriching journey into the realms of M&E.

The morning session commenced with an introduction to the fundamental concepts of M&E and randomized evaluations. Participants were acquainted with the work of J-PAL and CLEAR SA, leading organizations in the field, setting the context for subsequent discussions. A deep dive into impact evaluation methodologies and an exploration of Transfer of Unconditional Cash Transfers (TUP) evidence provided participants with invaluable insights into the power of rigorous evaluation in shaping programmatic decisions.

Following the session, the focus shifted towards understanding the Theory of Change (ToC). Through interactive exercises and discussions, participants were guided through the process of developing ToCs for interventions, emphasizing the importance of evidence in informing program design and implementation strategies. This session fostered a deeper appreciation for the interconnectedness between theory, evidence, and action.

The day's proceedings culminated with a session on generalizability, a crucial aspect in scaling evidence-based interventions. Participants were introduced to the framework of generalizability and its role in facilitating the transition from research findings to large-scale implementation. A case study on the TUP program served as a compelling example, illustrating how evidence-driven insights can drive meaningful change at scale.

As the second day dawned, participants reconvened with renewed enthusiasm, eager to delve deeper into M&E practices. The morning session commenced with insights into process monitoring, providing participants with a glimpse into JEEVIKA's Monitoring Information System (MIS) and showcasing exemplary process monitoring work led by J-PAL. Practical guidelines and best practices were shared, equipping participants with the tools needed for effective M&E implementation.

Following a brief break, the session transitioned to measurement concepts, emphasizing the importance of robust data collection methodologies. Participants were introduced to best practices in designing and piloting questionnaires, laying the groundwork for sound data collection practices. In the concluding session, the participants delved into data analytics and visualization, learning how to derive actionable insights from data. An interactive exercise using MIS data further reinforced learning outcomes, enabling participants to apply theoretical knowledge to real-world scenarios.

The day concluded with a feedback session, providing participants with an opportunity to reflect on their learning journey and offer suggestions for future improvements. A closing session and a heartfelt vote of thanks marked the end of the training, acknowledging the collaborative efforts that made the endeavor a success.

The training session served as a catalyst for empowering participants with the knowledge, skills, and tools needed to navigate the complexities of M&E effectively. By fostering a culture of evidence-based decision-making and continuous learning, the training has equipped participants to drive positive change in their communities. As they return to their respective roles, they carry with them a renewed sense of purpose and a commitment to nurturing impact through monitoring and evaluation.

Empowering Through Knowledge: Roshni Devi's Journey with JEEVIKA

In the vast tapestry of rural India, amidst the trials and triumphs of everyday life, stories of resilience and empowerment often emerge from the most unexpected corners. Roshni Devi's journey with JEEVIKA, spanning from the depths of despair to the heights of empowerment, serves as a poignant example of the transformative power of community-driven initiatives in bringing about positive change.

Roshni's story begins in the village of Bishnichak, nestled in the heart of rural Bihar. Four years ago, she experienced the joy of motherhood for

the first time, only to be met with unforeseen challenges. Her newborn child was born with a congenital disability, presenting Roshni and her family with a daunting set of obstacles. Despite seeking medical advice, they were met with the harsh reality that the child's condition was irreversible. Thus began Roshni's journey with JEEVIKA. In 2018, she officially became a member of the Mahadev JEEVIKA group, marking the beginning of a transformative chapter in her life. Through various training sessions and workshops conducted by the group, Roshni gained invaluable insights into essential health practices, nutrition, hygiene, and child care. She learned about the critical importance of the first thousand days of a child's life, equipping her with the knowledge and skills necessary to provide optimal care for her children. The impact of Roshni's involvement with the JEEVIKA group soon became evident in her own life and within her community. Armed with newfound knowledge and confidence, she took proactive steps to implement health and hygiene practices in her household. She diligently shared the information she had learned with her family members, raising awareness about the importance of proper nutrition, sanitation, and disease prevention. The positive changes brought about by Roshni's efforts rippled outward, influencing her entire community and fostering a culture of health-consciousness and empowerment. Today, Roshni stands as a beacon of hope and resilience in her village, inspiring others to follow in her footsteps. Empowering by Unity: Geeta Kisku's Journey of Resilience and Transformation

In the rustic settings of Dhamdaha Block, under the jurisdiction of the Purnia district, resides Geeta Kisku, a 43-year-old woman from the Satmi Dhunni village in the Kundi Panchayat. She belongs to a marginalized tribal community. After the demise of her husband, her family cast her aside. Life became exceedingly arduous for her thereafter. Daily wage labor wasn't readily available, making ends meet a constant struggle. However, it was her unwavering resilience that sustained her through those challenging times.

On May 17, 2010, Geeta found solace and support by joining the Gulab JEEVIKA Self-Help Group. She was elected as its president, entrusted with leading the group's activities. The group's initiatives provided Geeta with the encouragement and financial assistance she needed to bring about a significant change in her life. While she herself couldn't pursue higher education beyond the 9th grade, she relentlessly endeavors to provide her children with better opportunities. Her three



daughters are pursuing higher education—one in nursing, the second in graduation, and the third in intermediate.

Geeta's only sorrow is her inability to educate her son, who is differently abled and unable to walk. However, her association with the group empowered her to serve as a Community Mobilizer. With the honorarium she received for her role, life gradually became more manageable.

Subsequently, when the Chundari JEEVIKA Women's Village Organization and the Kranti JEEVIKA Cluster Level Foundation were formed, Geeta was elected as their chairperson. For several years, she served as the treasurer of the Renu JEEVIKA Training and Learning Centre in Purnia. She cultivates maize, rice, moong beans, and vegetables on a leased 17-acre plot of land, earning Rs. 1 lakh from farming alone in the past year. Additionally, she received Rs. 36,000 for serving as the president of the collective, Rs. 25,000 for operating the community distribution system by the village organization, and Rs. 5,000 for labor.

In total, her earnings amounted to Rs. 1,66,000 over the past year. Geeta has also contributed significantly to her community by serving as a resource person for community resources and by participating as an artist in cultural livelihoods through the Bangla Natok Dot Com platform, strengthening her financial position.

To finance her daughters' education, household repairs, and other expenses, Geeta has taken loans totaling Rs. 2,22,000 through her group. She has already repaid all her old loans, including interest. She has actively participated in campaigns against social evils, particularly raising awareness about drug addiction in the Santhal community. A large portion of her income has been spent on educating her daughters, ensuring they stand on their own feet and fulfill their dreams.
