The Graduation Approach: A Global Success Story

The Graduation Approach carefully sequenced support over 18-24 months, serving as a "big push" to help ultra-poor families attain sustainable livelihoods. Over the years, this approach has not only transformed individual lives but also entire communities. This approach, backed by BRAC, has been subjected to rigorous evaluations and research studies in various countries. The Graduation Approach has been adopted in more than 50 countries and has impacted over 14 million people globally. Its success lies in its holistic nature, offering a combination of financial support, training, asset transfers, and social integration, providing individuals with a sustainable pathway out of extreme poverty.

The Challenge of Scaling Up

While the Graduation Approach's effectiveness is well-documented, the challenge of scaling it up to reach a broader population remains. Scaling up such a program requires careful planning, coordination, and resources. It necessitates partnerships with governments and organizations willing to invest in the transformation of the ultra-poor's lives on a larger scale. In this context, Bihar, one of India's largest states, has emerged as a pioneer in the quest for scaling up the Graduation Approach through the Satat Jeevikoparjan Yojana (SJY).

Satat Jeevikoparjan Yojana (SJY): JEEVIKA's Flagship Initiative

Satat Jeevikoparjan Yojana (SJY) is a groundbreaking initiative launched by the Government of Bihar to scale up the Graduation Approach. This government-led program aims to reach every single people living in extreme poverty, making it the first of its kind in India. SJY represents a remarkable collaboration between the Government of Bihar, JEEViKA, Bandhan-Konnagar as a Technical Advisor, and J-PAL SA as a Knowledge Partner. Additionally, Co-Impact provides catalytic funding focused on strengthening the program's systems.

What makes SJY particularly innovative is its focus on systems strengthening and leveraging existing community institutions. Rather than building entirely new structures, SJY taps into the power of communities and their organizations to deliver and sustain the program. By doing so, it ensures that the Graduation Approach is effectively integrated into the fabric of rural Bihar. This approach aligns with the principle of 'going the last mile,' ensuring that no one is left behind in the fight against extreme poverty.

Pramika Devi's Prosperity Blossoms Through Papaya Farming

n the world of farming, where every crop has its unique charm, Pramika Devi from Dadha village in the Phulwariya Sajore Panchayat, nestled within the Shahkund block of Bhagalpur district, found her path to prosperity through papaya farming. Her story is a testament to how papaya farming can yield more than just healthy fruits—it can cultivate success. Pramika Devi, a member of the Saraswati JEEVIKA Self Help Group and the Sangam Jeev Mahila Gram Sangathan, decided to venture into papaya cultivation on her approximately 93 decimals of land. She took financial support of Rs. 40000 from the Saraswati SHG to initiate her business. What started as an experiment



soon turned into a flourishing enterprise, reaping profits to the tune of Rs 1.5 lakh annually. Her organic papayas have become a hot commodity in the market, making her an inspiration for others.

Initially, Pramika focussed on traditional crops like paddy and wheat, but low profits prompted her to explore papaya farming about four years ago. Starting with just 4-5 acres of land, she followed expert guidance from JEEVIKA's VRPs and Livelihood Specialist deputed at her block and achieved remarkable success. Encouraged by her initial results, she expanded her papaya cultivation to cover 93 decimals of land while diversifying the rest with crops like paddy, wheat, and more. Papaya farming comes with its season, running from March to November. Pramika procures papaya seeds from the Agricultural University in Sabour or from external sources, nurturing them into saplings at her own home. These saplings are then transplanted into her field. The total expenditure, including planting, nurturing, fertilization and irrigation, amounts to approximately Rs. 40,000 to Rs. 50,000.

The fruits begin to ripen by August-September, and Pramika's papayas find eager buyers among wholesalers and local customers. With no need to venture into the bustling markets herself, the papayas are bought directly from her farm. This results in an impressive income ranging from Rs 2 to 2.25 lakh. Deducting the farming expenses, Pramika still enjoys a net profit of about Rs 1.5 to Rs. 2.25 lakh from her one and a half bighas of land. This significant profit is a testament to the financial rewards papaya farming can offer. Pramika Devi and her family now dedicate themselves wholeheartedly to papaya cultivation, a choice that has led them towards the path of progress. The income generated from her two and a half bighas of land has provided her family with a comfortable and prosperous life.

Pramika Devi's story underscores the potential of cash crops like papaya to elevate the livelihoods of farmers. It serves as a shining example of how diversifying farming practices and embracing new opportunities can lead to remarkable success, proving that, indeed, the future of farming lies in the cultivation of innovation and profitability.

Transforming Lives

Empowering Dreams Through Resilience and Enterprise

oonam Devi, a determined resident of Amehta block in Bhojpur district, embarked on a remarkable journey of transformation. Prior to her involvement in the Satat Jeevikoparjan Yojana, her family faced formidable challenges. Her husband, Surendra Shah, was disabled and unable to work, leaving Poonam as the sole breadwinner. Their only daughter, too, aided her mother's struggle to make ends meet. To compound their hardships, they lacked a permanent place to call home.

Poonam Devi's life took a profound turn in February 2020 when she was selected by the Community Resource Service under Satat Jeevikoparjan Yojana, promoted by JEEVIKA. On the 23rd of September 2020, she received a Special Investment Fund (SIF) of Rs 10,000 after completing Capacity Building and Enterprise Development (CBED) training. By skillfully executing micro-planning by October 2020, she secured a Livelihood Investment Fund, along with a living wage of Rs 27,000. This financial support enabled her to establish a grocery shop. Determined and relentless, Poonam Devi poured her heart and soul into her



newfound business. Her husband joined her in managing the shop, and as their income started to grow steadily, they expanded their offerings to include fruits and vegetables. This diversification strategy proved to be a gamechanger, and her shop flourished.

Currently, Poonam Devi earns a monthly income ranging from Rs 10,000 to 12,000. On the 23rd of October 2022, she received a second installment of Rs 18,000 as a livelihood investment fund, which allowed her to introduce a refrigerator in the shop. This addition allowed her to sell juices and cold drinks during the scorching summer months, further increasing her earnings. Beyond business success, Poonam Devi seized the opportunity to enroll her daughter in school, nurturing her dream of a brighter future through education. She also accessed benefits from various government schemes, including insurance, the public distribution system, and access to tap water. Poonam Devi's aspirations don't stop here; she envisions opening a breakfast shop in the future, providing even better opportunities for herself and her family.

Poonam Devi not only achieved self-sufficiency but also forged her own identity and paved the way for a promising future for her family. Her story serves as an inspiring testament to the power of resilience, determination, and entrepreneurship.
