Office Order

Bihar Rural Livelihoods Promotion Society (JEEViKA) has the mandate of including 1.25 crore rural households into Self-Help Groups (SHGs). From the inception of BRLPS, special attention has been given on the inclusion of targeted population in terms of Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Minorities, and other vulnerable households in forming Self-Help Groups in Bihar. All BPIUs are playing very instrumental role in identifying target households, taking targeted households into SHGs and declaring village saturation as per office order (Ref. BRLPS/Project/728/14/4308 dated 27.02.15 and BRLPS/Project/728/14/410 dated 02.05.17).

In the last few months, almost all BPIUs have celebrated 'SHG formation day' for increasing the pace of SHG formation. Recently, BRLPS has also started Satat Jeevikoparjan Yojna (SJY) for promoting Livelihoods of ultra-poor households after including them. Under multiple strategies of including target households, special day for SHG formation, ultra-poor households, and village saturation have included more than 95.5 lakh rural households into 8.16 lakh SHGs covering 36158 villages/ hamlets and 7946 panchayats as on Oct.'18. The average membership is 11.6 SHGs. For quality intervention, it is important to reiterate to maintain membership of 12-15 in each SHG.

Based on learning, it is important to give prime focus on covering un-entered villages/ habitations, timely inclusion of SC/ ST/ Minorities/ Vulnerable/ Ultra-poor households into SHGs and declaring saturation of villages, panchayats, blocks, and districts with the formation of SHGs. For ensuring this, three fold strategies have been reiterated as follows:

1. For Un-entered Villages

- a. All BPIUs field staffs will need to mandatory make village entry in the remaining unentered villages in two phases (Nov.-Dec.,' 18 and Jan.-Feb.'19) adopting following strategies:
 - It is mandatory for all field staffs (CCs/ACs) to make village entry for proper targeting and forming at least two new SHGs before the CRP drive. During village entry and mobilization, all field staffs will primarily focus on including SC/ ST/ Minorities/ Vulnerable households into SHG fold. The average membership in each SHG should be 12-15. The first two SHGs formed by field staffs in each un-entered villages will act as reference SHGs for CRP teams.
 - During initial social mobilization in the villages, all field staffs will conduct social mapping exercise depicting SC/ ST/ Minorities/ vulnerable households and develop village profile including details of targeted households (in numbers).
 - The concern field staff will submit the social map/ village profile to concern BPIU.
 - Based on targeting (social mapping/village profile), the concern BPIU will deploy CRP teams for SHG formation (priority should be given to villages having high concentration of SCs/ STs/ Minorities/ vulnerable HHs).
- b. All potential BPIUs will take support of internal CRP teams for forming SHGs in the unentered villages' at least in two phases (Nov.-Dec.' 18 and Jan.-Feb.'19). All deployed CRP teams will cover at least 2-3 villages and will ensure inclusion of all target households (SC/ ST/ Minorities/ Vulnerable) within stipulated time period.





2. Through formed Village Organisation

Reiterating the saturation approach, a joint effort needs to be adopted by field staffs, community professionals, and VO for including left-out HHs into existing SHGs or into

- a. For this, all formed VOs till March'17, should generate a list of left-out households (as per operational area: ward/ village) with their proper reason of exclusion through their formed Social Action Committee (SAC)/ Community Professionals (CM/ VO BK) in the month of Dec.-Jan.'19.
- b. Reiterating incentive support to community mobiliser (Project IBCB/ 1042/ 16/ 277 dated 03.05.18) for forming new SHGs, concern Community Mobilisers will get an incentive of Rs. 200 per SHG after submission of SHG profiles.
- All SHGs leaders (Office Bearers of SHGs) will also dedicate their time in their tola/ village in identifying the left-out HHs and their inclusion in the existing SHGs.
- d. In the monthly meetings, all VOs will review their SAC/ CM/ VO BK for inclusion status of left-out HHs into existing SHGs or in the newly formed SHGs.
- e. All VOs need to maintain the average SHGs of 15-20.

3. Through Village and Panchayat Saturation

For ensuring saturation of village in terms of forming SHGs, each VO will generate list of including target households and left-out households (with specific reasons). Based on generated list VO will declare saturation in terms of forming SHGs in their operational area (wards/ villages). Based on saturation list generated by all VOs, the concern panchayat will declare its saturation after proper ratification in the Gram Sabha. Only one panchayat saturation certificate will be released from each panchayat (as per attached format). In addition to this, all VOs will declare and update their membership/ saturation in their Annual General Meeting (AGM) in every financial year. The process of generating list of including target households and declaring saturation of its operational area will also be applicable by the formed VOs under federations (WDC-JEEViKA).

DPCUs may conduct special CRP round of SHG CRP teams for validating panchayat saturation in terms of including all target households into SHGs. Similarly, block(s) will declare it saturation with the saturation of all panchayats in a formal meeting at block/ district level. A formal meeting will be organised by inviting all VO representatives, Block Development Officer, Panchayat representative, Block Project Manager, Block Mentor, and District Project Manager for official declaration of block/district saturation. Each BPIU can do maximum expenditure of Rs. 10,000 for organising this event at block/ district level.

4. Help-Desk Strategy (at BPIU and DPCU)

For dedicated and timely facilitation support, 'Help-Desk' comprises of 2-3 community professionals (Community Resource Person/ Community Mobiliser having at least 2 years of working experience with JEEViKA) need to be placed at BPIU level. The concern BPMs need to ensure separate sitting and required necessary arrangement for the members of Help-Desk at BPIU. Before seeking support from selected community professionals as members of Help-Desk concern BPIU need to ensure selection/ replacement of suitable community mobilisers.

All members of 'Help-Desk' will be paid on monthly basis as per the provision of internal CRP policy. As a team, members of Help-Desk will ensure the following tasks:

- a. Follow-up with VO leaders and CM/ VO BK for ensuring listing of target/ left-out households and saturation of villages/ panchayats.
- b. Daily follow-up with the internal CRP teams (during CRP round) for ensure proper village entry, SHG formation and submission of SHGs' profiles at BPIU.
- c. Escalation of operational issues (if any) up to BPM for its timely solution.
- d. Compilation of data and reporting to BPM.



Similarly, as required by the BPIU team, timely facilitation support of concern Manager-M&E/ Incharge and ICB Manager/In charge supported by one Office Assistant are required at DPCU level. As a team, members of district facilitation team will ensure the following tasks:

- a. Follow-up with BPMs for timely village entry, SHG formation, submission of SHGs' profiles and updating of membership in SHG profile in the MIS.
- b. Follow-up for saturation of villages/ panchayats.
- c. Daily follow-up with the 'Help-Desk' at BPIU level (during CRP round) for ensure proper village entry, SHG formation and submission of SHGs' profiles through internal CRP teams at BPIU.
- d. Compilation of data and reporting to SPMU.

5. Updating in MIS

All BPIUs should ensure timely updating of member's details in existing SHGs and profile of newly formed SHGs in the MIS. For this, all BPIUs need to take print out of existing SHG profile from the MIS and circulate it to the Community Mobilizers through their VOs for members' updating. The concern field staffs need to collect the SHG profiles (with members' details), details about **ZERO/ LESS THAN TEN memberships in SHGs** and submit it to the BPIUs for MIS updating. All BPMs need to review and ensure timely updating of MIS.

All BPMs, Block Mentors, and DPMs are directed to review timely inclusion of SCs/ STs/ Minorities and vulnerable households into SHGs and ensure saturation status of villages, panchayats and block(s) on **PRIORITY** basis. The printing of formats will be done at the block level. All DPCUs need to send a compiled status of formed SHGs and saturation of villages, panchayats, and blocks as per proposed plan (annexure) on weekly basis to the SPMU.
