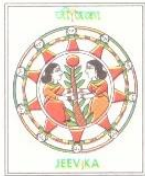

### Office Order

#### Plan & Budget under Farm livelihoods for the FY-2022-23

The following Farm Livelihoods interventions have been considered for the FY 2022-23 across the state.

1. The district wise detail Plan and budget is attached on **Annexure-1**.
2. **HH coverage under Farm Intervention**
  - I. DPM and BPM will ensure minimum 35% coverage of total household entered in CBO MIS till March-2022. This would be considered during the performance appraisal to CC, AC, BPM, DPM, Block Mentors in the concerned districts.
  - II. The inclusion of HHs under farm interventions will only be considered after the entry of farmer card data in MIS both profile and transaction sheet.
3. **Livelihoods subcommittee at VO/CLF**  
BPM will ensure the formation and functioning of livelihoods subcommittee in each VO and CLF in tune of NRLM advisory.
4. **Training and capacity building of Cadres (VRPs/SEWs/AEs) and staff:**
  - I. Related expenditure may be booked as per the approved budget of BRLPS -AAP for FY 2022-23 under the budget line, amount and unit cost mentioned. The cost norm may be referred as per the office order BRLPS/Proj-IBCB/1042/16/3691, Dated: 15.12.17. The Budget Head may be booked as per **Annexure-II**.
  - II. District/Block/cluster level nonresidential training must be done at FTIC only. The efforts should be made for hiring of training facility of FTIC by the external agencies (line department and non-government agencies) as per FTIC policy. The concerned BPM will ensure training of all themes in FTIC as per the FTIC policy. TLC if available in that area may also be used for the residential training.
  - III. The residential training of staff and cadres should be included in the District Training calendar with support of IBCB Manager. Training of staff and related cadres should be completed 10 days before commencement of the Rabi, Kharif and Zaid season.



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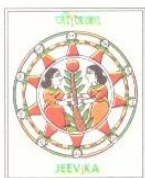


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IV. The district may take a demonstration of new technology after submitting a proposal to SPMU via DPCU and receiving approval from SPM/PM-Farm, fund expenditures will be made at the block level.

#### 5. **Cadres in Farm Intervention**

- I. Community Mobilizer of the respective VO is responsible for mobilization of SHG member towards farm interventions and prepare the list of interested farmers and provide it to VRP for further handhold or technical support.
- II. CM will handhold SHG members in Farm interventions and motivate farmers to adopt the technology. In lieu of that CM will receive Rs 10/- per farmer per month as incentive, maximum up to Rs 800/- per month from the concerned VO. The expenditure of same may be booked under cadre Honorarium budget head as per the annexure-II.
- III. DPM, Manager-LH, LHS & Procurement Manager will ensure the availability of VRP register at VO/CLF level for data entry.
- IV. Task Appraisal of VRP and SEW will be done on quarterly basis to monitor agriculture interventions in presence of livelihoods subcommittee, LHS/AC and CLF-OB members.
- V. Each VRP will look after 3 Vos in general and exception may be 2 VO per VRP as per the geographical. They will serve to all farmers of the concerned VO considering whatever be the number of farmers in that VO. VRP will submit the monthly report during CLF meeting which will be verified by LH subcommittee and appraise by the CLF office bearers for Payment process.
- VI. Honorarium of VRP will now be done through CLF of their operational area.
- VII. VRP will receive Rs 20/- per farmer upto Rs 3750/- monthly for coverage of farmers and handhold support under farm interventions in 2-3 VOs.
- VIII. VRP will receive incentive of Rs 200/- per VO/month for providing training / Meeting to VO members maximum up to INR 1000/- per month in addition to the honorarium.
- IX. Minimum educational qualification for VRP should be 10<sup>th</sup> pass and should be a farmer and above 18 years of age. Female candidate should be preferred for VRP position; if suitable female candidates are difficult to find, in such situation the ratio of 80(female):20(male) in each district should be maintained. VRP should have smart phone and aware of its function.



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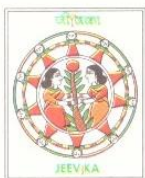
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- X. BPM should ensure monthly review meeting of VRP/ SEW / AE at block level under his/her leadership and appraise to DPM and Manager-LH.
- XI. The BPM will ensure timely payment of VRP / SEW on monthly basis in their account. If VRP /SEW provides any training outside their CLF he/she will receive Rs 400/- per day from host CLF based on reimbursement basis from budget head of cadre honorarium.
- XII. Payment of VRP will be made based on monthly reporting Format of VRP and SEW as attached on annexure- V & VI.
- XIII. The payment of VRPs/SEWs will be done as per the approved AAP budget of FY 2021-2022 under cadre honorarium. The Budget Head may be referred as per the **Annexure-II**.
- XIV. SEW will provide handhold and technical support to VRP on fortnightly basis and provide regular training to VRPs and CMs and track the VRP and CM activity in his cluster. He will also ensure regular updating of VRP register by VRPs. Every CLF should have one SEW only.
- XV. The SEW will receive Rs 3/- per farmers from his CLF based on total no. of farmers serving by their VRP in his cluster.
- XVI. SEW will also receive incentive of Rs 200/- per training to VO members and VRP in his cluster maximum up to Rs 1000/- per month.
- XVII. He/she will also receive Rs -500/- per month for maintaining the Books of record of CHC and tracking served farmers and income of CHC. SEW will be responsible to manage, entry of data and handhold CHC in their cluster in coordination with OB members of CLF.
- XVIII. One time assistance to VRP/SEW will be provided for convergence support to farmers, detail is as follows:

## 6. Kitchen Garden

Manager farm in coordination with H&N Manager will promote Kitchen Garden as universal intervention among SHG household to improve nutritional parameters.



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## 7. Custom Hiring Center (CHC)

CHC will be established in CLF / FPOs under convergence with the Department of Agriculture. The CHC will be established as per the CHC policy office order No: BRLPS/Proj-LH/1673/19/595 Dated: 11.06.2020 and the community procurement policy of BRLPS. Once the subsidy is received by the concerned CLF/VO, the advance received for the same would be returned and UC submitted for the rest amount to DPCU. In case of unavailability of fund with the Dept. of agriculture in writing, the concerned district will establish CHC the project fund.

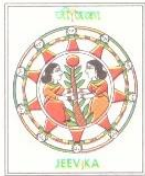
## 8. Organic Cluster

- I. In the area of organic cluster, no inorganic fertilizers or pesticides will be promoted or sold by any cadres, AEs or member in any form. It will be the responsibility of DPM, BPM and Manger-LH to monitor the same in the field. In case of not abiding the guideline, BPIU in coordination with DPCU may proceed for cancelation of license and services of concerned Cadres.
- II. AEs will promote organic/ natural farming in his or her area with integration of natural pest protection measures and soil management measures through their shop.

## 9. Convergence Schemes

- I. In convergence with the Directorate of Horticulture, the **Community Drip irrigation system** will be installed by district as per plan mentioned on the annexure-v.
  - II. **Poly house/ Shednet establishment under JEEVIKA model** will be implemented in districts with minimum of 1000 Sq. meter area. The details of budget are given in annexure -I & IV. Fund may be transferred from DPCU to CLF for this activity on the request of CLF and recommendation from BPM and Manager-LH.
  - III. The Concerned DPM /BPM, Block Mentor and District Mentor will do close follow up at their levels. Block project Manager will be the nodal person at the block level and DPM at district level for regular follow up with the District Agriculture officer/District Horticulture officer after the submission of applications.
10. Each district will take Paddy Nursery in their area as enterprise by VRP/cadres/AE.
  11. DPM and BPM will ensure all the livelihoods activities in model CLF according to the guideline issued by NRLM.
  12. Intercomponent budget within the total approved budget may be utilized as per procurement need for CHC, FTIC and VTB.
  13. All approved FTIC must be establish by 30<sup>th</sup> Sep-2022 compulsorily. The average training per FTIC must not be less than six training in each month.

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14. The collection center, Millets cluster Plan and budget, Moringa Cluster plan and Budget and Pulses Cluster Plan and Budget is mentioned in annexure-VI, VII, VIII, IX respectively.
  15. Where there is no LHS posted, BPM will nominate farm Nodal person among the existing lot of AC/CC at block level. BPM will review monthly to all staff on farm indicators panchayat / cluster wise and CC /AC wise respectively and appraise the DPM & Manager-LH.
  16. The DPM will conduct the separate monthly district livelihoods review meeting with Manager-LH, block mentors & BPIU staff and send a report to PM & SPM-Farm by 10<sup>th</sup> of every month.
  17. This office order is effective from 1<sup>st</sup> June 2022 to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2023.
