Office Order

Plan & Budget for Livelihoods Farm Intervention (FY-2020-21)

The following Livelihoods Farm interventions have taken into the plan of FY 202021 across the state.

- The district wise detailed Plan and budget is attached as Annexure-1.
- The payment of VRPs/SEWs/DG VRPs/MRPs will be done as per the approved AAP budget of 2019-20 under cadre honorarium, it will be considered as ongoing activity for FY-2020-21, the budget line, amount and unity cost will be same as approved in 2019-20; the Budget Head may be referred as per Annexure-II.
- 3. The Training and capacity building of Cadres (VRPs/SEWs/DG-VRP/MRPs) and staff may be booked as per the approved budget of BRLPS AAP 2019-20, the budget line, amount and unit cost will be same. The cost norm may be referred as per the office order BRLPS/Proj-IBCB/1042/16/3691, Dated: 15.12.17. The Budget Head may be referred as per Annexure-II.
- Honorarium of VRP/SEW should be transferred in advance of the next quarter at VOs & CLFs based on cadre indent.
- Every District will ensure the entry of farmer's card on regular basis in MIS. The DPM and the concerned BPM will be responsible for the entry of farmer data in MIS.
- The unit cost for the Demonstration of an innovative technology is Rs. 10000/- per plot of 0.5 acres.
 The cost of demo plot will be routed through the concerned VO/CLF/LG/PG as required for the purpose
 of showcasing of a new technology at a farmer's plot.
- 7. In the area of organic cluster no inorganic fertilizers or pesticides will be promoted or sold by any cadres, AEs or suppliers in any form. It will be the responsibility of DPM, BPM and Manger-LH to monitor the same in the field by the local groups of organic cluster.
- In coordination with HNS team the Kitchen Garden will be treated as a regular and universal farming intervention to promote nutritional security. CM/VRP will be incentivized as per the kitchen garden / the VRP policy for inclusion of HH under the kitchen garden intervention.
- 9. BPM will ensure the formation and function of livelihoods subcommittee in VO and CLF positively in light of the advisory of NRLM which was already circulated. Livelihoods will one of the prime agenda in every VO and CLF meeting. The BPM will review monthly to AC/CC on livelihoods interventions and send report to SPMU based on 10% physical verification of the field.
- 10. DPM and BPM will ensure coverage of 30% CBOs households under farm intervention along with other core activity as per the project mandate to award CC, AC, BPM, DPM, Block Mentors as "A" Grade in the performance appraisal. One year old VO may be taken for the calculation of HHs under the farm activity.
- 11. The expenditure for Digital Green activities such as training and meeting may be booked as per the pervious office order No. BRLPS/BTDP/Proj-LH/1132/17/2293, Dated: 13.09.2019.
- 12. Where there is no VRP in VO, CM will support SHG members to handhold in Farm intervention and motivate farmers to adopt the technology. CM will get incentives of Rs 10 per farmer per month maximum upto Rs 700/- per month for the concerned VO. The expenditure of same may be booked under cadre Honorarium budget head.
- 13. Aggregation and marketing support is to be provided to PGs/VO/CLFs for promotion of local sale of vegetables in local area. The unit cost for per CBO will be Rs 250000/- which includes vending cart, specially designed vending E -rickshaw, crates, banners, Initial transportation cost, any honorarium to

BRLPS

- cadres, weighing machine, billing machine, Books of record, etc. This enterprise will run by any entrepreneurs of local area associated with SHG. The detail is given in annexue-IV.
- 14. Custom Hiring Center will be established in CLF / FPOs under convergence with the Department of Agriculture. The CHC will be established as per the CHC policy office order No: BRLPS/Proj-LH/1172/17/3136 Dated: 04.11.17 and the community procurement policy of BRLPS. Once the subsidy is received by the concerned CLF/VO, the advance received for the same would be returned and UC submitted for the rest amount to DPCU.
- 15. Family Drip Irrigation system will be procured by an individual SHG member under convergence with the Directorate of Horticulture. Online application will be generated with the assistance of concerned VRP/CC/AC/LHS at block level. Necessary follow up with concerned district level Horticulture / Agriculture officer for technical assistance and release of subsidy to be done by BPM at block level and
- 16. Community appraisal of VRP and SEW will be on monthly basis to monitor agriculture interventions and facilitate timely payment of honorarium. Payment & appraisal will be made on the basis of monthly reporting Format. Each VRP will look after 2-3 VO in his/her village and serve all farmers of that VO considering whatever be the number of farmer in VO. As honorarium to VRP, he /she has to submit the monthly report in VO and VO LH subcommittee will verify at least 10-15 farmers after verification of committee VRP will receive Rs 25/- per farmers upto Rs 4500/- maximum. The BPM will ensure timely payment of VRP & SEW, DG-VRP/MRP etc. on monthly basis. If VRP provides any training outside in other VO he/she will receive Rs 500/- per day.
- 17. For each training provided by VRP/SEW outside block/district VRP will receive as per VRP policy.
- 18. Community Drip irrigation system will be installed at CLF/Nodal VO where there is more concentration of land under cash crops for SHG members. Fund will be transferred to the concerned CBO from DPCU. The detail plan is given in annexure-III.
- 19. Poly Houses will be established in cluster based approach. One cluster will have five poly house units which should be installed at CLF/Nodal VO where there is more concentration of land under horticultural crops. The detail plan is given in annexure-IV. The details of Direct Farm to home marketing model are given on annexure-V.
- 20. DPM, Manager-LH, LHS, Procurement Manager will ensure the availability of VRP register at VO/CLF level for data entry.
- 21. The Concerned DPM /BPM, Block Mentor and District Mentor will do close follow up at their levels. Block project Manager will be nodal person at the block level and DPM at district level for regular follow up with the District Agriculture officer/District Horticulture officer after the submission of
- 22. Seed production village will develop in a district with support of FPC and initiate the seed production of Rice, Wheat, Pulses and Oilseed. Every District where FPC has formed will cover at least 100 farmers under seed production and take it as business opportunity. The DPM will review the seed production programme on monthly basis to strengthen quality seed supply.
- 23. Block/ cluster level non residential training must be done at FTIC only. The effort should be made for hiring of training space of FTIC by external agencies (Government, Non-government agencies) as per FTIC policy. The concerned BPM will ensure training of all themes in FTIC as per FTIC policy. TLC if available may also be used.
- 24. The residential training of staff and cadres should be included in the District Training calendar with support of the concerned thematic Manager.
- 25. Community appraisal of VRP and SEW will do on monthly basis to monitor the agriculture interventions and facilitates timely payment of honorarium. Payment & appraisal will complete on the basis of monthly reporting format. The BPM will ensure timely payment of VRP/SEW, DG-VRP/MRP etc.
- 26. Each Cluster should have only one SEW whatever be the number of VRP in cluster. Additional SEW may be kept at FTIC and CHC for day to day functioning of centers and data entry. SEW payment will be done as per the CHC SOP policy.
- 27. BPM should ensure monthly review meeting of VRPs, SEWs DG-VRPs, AEs at block level under his/her leadership.

- 28. Each BPM nominates one nodal person for livelihoods farm intervention among AC/CC at block level. All ACs and CCs will be responsible for LH activity in their concerned field and all have to do Livelihoods work.
- 29. The inclusion of HHs under farm intervention will only be considered after the entry of data in farmer card and uploaded in MIS. The BPM will ensure the upload of the complete farmer card in MIS.
- 30. In Covid-19 pandemic the DPM, BPM, Manager-LH/IC, Block mentors will responsible to ensure proper social distancing, mask and gloves by cadres while providing training to farmers. DPM, BPM, Manager-LH/IC, Block mentors will also make available the farmer card in the field and take review in the concerned monthly meeting of block and district.
- 31. The DPM will conduct the separate monthly district livelihoods review meeting with Manager-LH, block mentors & BPIU staff and send a report to PM & SPM-Farm by $10^{\rm th}$ of every month.
- 32. It is the responsibility of DPM and Manager-LH to integrate the complete farmer card and Livelihoods data in MIS.
- SPM-LH has been delegated to identify four people from across districts/blocks to work with him on agricultural activity as help desk strategy from June-2020 to May- 2021 at SPMU level.
- 34. The fund to Producer Group may be transferred in NRETP Blocks as per NRETP guideline which is as follows;
 - a. One time Infrastructure grant upto INR 50000 would be provided to each of the PGs for purchase of productive infrastructure such as weighing scale, moisture meter, tablets/smart phone for accounting, book-keeping and business facilitation, sieve, crates and other material handling items.
 - b. Working capital loan The PG would be provided a working capital loan from the CLF of upto INR 1.5 lakhs against the business plan. The rate of interest would not exceed 7% and this working capital loan would be repaid to the CLF at the end of every season.
 - c. Training and capacity building The PG would be provided training on commodity handling, business operations, basic accounting etc and exposure visits to best practicing sites. The PG would also be provided support by the Udyog Mitra (CRP)/ Agri entrepreneur.
- Every District will engage migrants families under farm intervention and report data separately which
 is to be reported to the Govt. of Bihar time to time. The interventions for migrants may be as follows;
 - Potential migrant will be developed as Village Resource Persons, Agri-Entrepreneurs and Master Trainers.
 - Identification of migrant families who are interested to do agriculture will engage under farm interventions and access crop loan through SHG and banks.
- c. 3. Potential migrants will be facilitated to set up poly house/net house/multitier nurseries etc. 36. This Plan & Budget of farm activity will be effective from 1st June -2020 to 31st May-2021.

- 1. To initiate the Shednet/polyhouse eight (8) member group is to be formed (General /OBC caste) or SC/ST caste group.
- 2. This scheme is done in cluster based approach which means it should be done in local vicinity. The minimum unit size would be 1000 Sq.meter per unit.
- 3. One Shednet/Polyhouse will have minimum 1000 Sq.meter managed by one or more farmers. Likewise 5 units of 1000 Sq.meter will be established in one cluster in the same area.
- 4. One unit (1000Sq.meter) will run by any individual entrepreneur/farmers as approved by CLF.
- 5. CBO will invest 70% of total contribution and rest 30% will bear by the concern farmer.
- 6. CBO will charge Rs 25000/- annual as user fee in four installments in lieu of CBO investment till the date of final adjustment of CBO contribution. Thereafter the ownership of Shednet/polyhouse will be transferred to an individual farmer.
- 7. Farmer will also have the option to repay total CBOs contributed amount at once or in some higher installments to get the ownership earlier.
