OFFICE ORDER

(Enhancement in the amount of Revolving Fund to SHGs)

Once SHGs are formed, internal saving of the community members is an important source of corpus with poor households for internal rotation. To aid the process of internal rotation, enhance the size of the corpus and bring in the element of vibrancy at the level of SHGs, concept of **Revolving Fund** has been introduced. It has been suggested by National Rural Livelihoods Mission. MORD, Gol (through letter No. J-11014/01/2020-RL (FMS-371340) dated 31st March 2022) annexed as "**Annexure-A**" that Self Help Groups can be provided with revised revolving fund of maximum Rs. 30,000/- (Rupees Thirty Thousand only) per SHG by different State Rural Livelihoods Missions. **This amount will remain with different SHGs as a seeding capital and will be grant to the SHGs.**

At present the maximum limit for providing Revolving Fund to SHGs stands at Rs 15,000 per SHG (As per the decision of the Executive Committee in its 32nd meeting). Considering the need of seeding capital to the SHGs to achieve sustainability, guideline issued by NRLM & approval of Executive Committee in its 62nd meeting, it has been decided to provide Revolving Fund up to a maximum limit of Rs. 30,000/- (Rupees Thirty Thousand) per SHG.

In the light of the above-mentioned facts, all the districts are directed to provide additional amount of Rs. 15,000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand Only) to each of the SHGs that are following Panchasutras and have received Rs. 15,000 earlier. All the staffs need to be oriented about the enhancement in Revolving Fund as it has an impact on the sustainability of the SHGs (Self Help Groups). The staffs in turn will ensure sensitization of the Community Cadres and Community Institutions (SHGs, VOs and CLFs), so that the additional amount of Revolving Fund is utilized judiciously.

The amount needs to be provided to the Savings Account of SHGs / Savings

Account of Village Organisations. This is based on the discussion with DPMs and other DPCU members. It is further made explicit that District has to make only one choice (either through SHGs or through VO). It can not be combination of both for any specific district. Proper care has to be taken to ensure that capital is made available to all such SHGs that are following Panchasutra.

All the districts and blocks are directed to ensure prompt transfer of additional amount to the accounts of SHGs on priority. The expenditure shall be booked under the following heads:

It needs to be noted that the existing guideline circulated through Office Order No. BRLPS/Proj-FI/497/14/Vol-VI/810 Dated 05-07-2021 will remain valid for Initial Capitalization Fund of different tranches through Village Organisations (VOs) and Cluster Level Federations (CLFs).

This order is applicable with immediate effect.

Subject: Enhancement in grant assistance to RSETIs for meeting expenditure on construction of building regarding.

Sir/ Madam,

I am directed to say that as per the extant guidelines this Ministry has been providing grant assistance @ ₹ 1.00 crore in two instalments of ₹ 50 lakh each to one RSETI in a district for construction of building to concerned RSETI sponsor Bank through NIRD & PR.

2. The grant assistance amount of ₹1.00 crore for construction of RSETI building was decided in 2009 and since then, the construction cost has escalated considerably over the years. Requests from RSETI sponsor banks have also been received to increase the grant assistance amount of ₹ 1 crore on account of escalation in construction cost.

3. Therefore, the matter to enhance the amount of grant assistance for construction of RSETI building has been considered in the Ministry in consultation with various agencies. Keeping in view the inflation in construction cost and to cover it up, it has been decided with the approval of Competent Authority:

- (a) To increase the amount of grant assistance from existing ₹1.00 crore to ₹ 2.00 crore for construction of RSETI building.
- (b) RSETIs which have been issued only first instalment of ₹ 50 Lakh, can be allowed escalation on balance part (2^{nd)} Instalment) and will now be given ₹ 1 Crore instead of ₹ 50 Lakhs.
- 4. The above decision will come in force with immediate effect.
- 5. This is for information and necessary action of all stake holders.
